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


OUR MISSION

ACCESSIBILITY



The Children's Museum of Wilmington believes in the power of every child learning through play. That is why we strive to accommodate the needs of all guests by providing financial, physical, emotional, and intellectual access in a welcoming and safe environment.

This year we have made important progress towards becoming more accessible and inclusive. Some of the measures include:

- free access to noise cancelling headphones,
- offering a speech therapy guide,
- creating a sound sensory map (conscious use of colors),
- offering the Exclusive Adventure Pass,
- giving free visits for caregivers,
- preparing a social narrative (prepare before visit),
- featured website map available to show access to the closest bus stop and free trolley stop,
- participating in the Museums For All program and more!

We are continually learning and collaborating with local partners who support us in this mission. We have met with/invited to visit/continue to work with: The Children's Museum of Miami, NC Maritime Museum at Southport, Fort Fisher Aquarium, Coastline Therapy Group, Cape Fear Community College's Occupational Therapist program, New Hanover County Schools, The Autism Society, Early Intervention, NC Division of Services for the Blind, and NC Division of Services for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

NEW HANDS-ON EXHIBITS

Wonders Of Water!

Explore Water - it's Quality and Conservation! This exhibit, funded by the Duke Energy Water Resources Fund, International Paper, and The Women's Impact Network, educates children on the importance of the water cycle while examining natural vs. man-made filtration.



The exhibit focuses on the importance of nutrition and eating healthy food to provide energy for the body. This area educates children on the five food groups, how to create a balanced meal, and how to live a healthier lifestyle.

PORT CMoW

Port CMoW introduces children to the Port of Wilmington in a fun and educational setting allowing them to understand what it truly means to live in or visit the "Port City."













GRANTS







City of Wilmington - Funding from the City of Wilmington supported general operations including Museum maintenance, utilities, salaries.

Delta Dental Foundation - The September Smiles event and our *Discovery Diner* exhibit were both made possible through funding from the *Delta Dental Foundation*. The funding provided activity materials and free admission to the event which was held at the MLK Center.

NC Grassroots Science Museums Collaborative - Support for the salary of our STEM educators, STEM outreach, S.T.E.A.M. Explorations daily program, and STEM exhibits in our Science Center: *The Science of You* and the *Discovery Diner* was received from the NC Grassroots Science Museums Collaborative.

International Paper - Funding from International Paper allowed us to implement the structural components for the water wall and vortex in our Wonders of Water exhibit.

Landfall Foundation - The Landfall Foundation provided funding to revitalize the Toddler Treehouse and Port CMoW exhibits. This included painting the Toddler Treehouse, adding more manipulatives, a new train table for the ports, and a custom Wilmington themed train table.

New Hanover County - A grant received from New Hanover County provided the means for the Museum to create the Discovery Diner and provide educational daily programming centered around healthy eating. Programming included the in-house MyPlate program, as well as community outreach programming at the MLK Center, Brigade Boys and Girls Club, and SmartStart of New Hanover County.

NC Science Network - Funding from the NC Science Network was received for STEM education.

North Carolina Community Foundation - The North Carolina Community Foundation and their Healing Communities Fund provided a grant to help nonprofits in NC that experienced financial strain due to COVID-19.





MEMBERSHIPS, VISITORS & OUTREACH

The Children's Museum of Wilmington welcomes over 55,000 visitors each year. As of June 2021, we have 551 active members. 32 Contributing memberships were donated to underserved families in our community. 25% of admissions are free or reduced.
